
We have staff stationed on all entrances for the safety of our youngest children, who may not be as aware that they are in our care once in school.

**Surrey Arts** would like to invite all young musicians to come along and try out some of the local ensembles at their open evening on **Wednesday 17th January**.


**5.15- 6.30pm**
