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Kids for Kids

We had a special visitor with some areat news this week- Patricia Parker from Kids for Kids- to tell us all about what the charity have been able to do with the money YOU have been raising.

Patricia reminded us about the important work that the charity does in the Darfur region of Sudan, providing help, training and ways to help families help themselves by lending goats to families to help provide

them with basic nutrition through goats' milk. Patricia presented us with a certificate confirming that, this year, St. Paul's School has raised £2298 through the amazing efforts of the dad's rowing team in the autumn term, collections at the Christmas services, and through the hard work of several of our children who set out, on their own, to run a stall at the Christmas Fair. At the end of the assembly, the Year 4 children involved were presented with their own special certificates too to celebrate all their hard work.

St. Paul's have raised enough money to buy 57 goats this year. Right now, you are helping 9 families to build a healthy future. In two years, another 9 families will take on your goats, and in another two years the cycle will continue. That's around 130 children who are able to drink- and benefit from- goats' milk every day!
