Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope this letter finds you and your family well and that you are adjusting to our new 'normal'. Thank you to you all for following our staggered drop off/pick up routines—on the whole these are working very well. However some parents are lingering and chatting in the lane—please refrain from doing this as it means other parents can't pass by with a 2m gap, particularly if they have a pushchair. Please also keep to the left to enable people to pass safely. Thank you too to those parents who have requested details for the Sainsbury's parking permit; this significantly reduces traffic in St Paul's Road West and enables everyone to stay safe on this last part of the walk into school. Please remember that no one should be driving beyond the end of the path outside the church between 8.30 and 9.05.

As you will see overleaf, we have been very busy since returning and have all settled well into new classes. One of our school values is perseverance and many classes have been looking at this along with the 'R' of resilience to explore effective learning behaviours.

This week, you will have received separate information about changes we have made to your recording of your child's reading. Please use this new weekly reading record and send it back to school just on Fridays. You will then receive a new one for the following week. As you will appreciate, we are striving to minimise equipment coming back and forward. We are moving to a system where homework will also be sent and received remotely but we will share more about that with you in the next couple of weeks. As you know we are already setting maths homework through Doodle Maths. Mr Hill will be sending out a separate letter to remind you of how to access this app. Your child can also access 'Times Tables Rockstar' to help with swift recall of their tables. 'Little and often' really helps to sharpen recall.

Having taken advice, we are extending our 'bubbles' to year groups both inside and out. The very large majority of teaching will still be within class groups but we will have times where some children from each class will be working together with an adult in a separate space. The extension of this bubble is essential to optimise effective teaching, but we will still minimise as far as possible the adults that work within these bubbles. This is still fully within the government guidance.

As you know, FOSPA does a tremendous job supporting school and raising money for key projects.
