Key aims/success criteria

- I can recognise and write the new sounds I learn.
- I can recognise the tricky words when reading and identify them in a sentence.
- I can have a go at writing the new sounds and put them into sentences.



Revisit

Let's practise some sounds we already know. Today we are going to focus on digraphs (two letters that make one sound)

Read them together-

ow igh ar or

Now practise writing them (without looking!) Check what you have written. Did you forget any letters? Did you get any letters round the wrong way? Which ones did you find tricky/easy?

Can you think of any words that have these sounds in?



New grapheme

Today we are learning a new grapheme

oy

Like in the word 'toy'

Say it loud, say it quietly, say it to yourself, say it to someone
else



Writing 'oy'

Now have a go at writing the sound 'oy' (try and write your letters with the lead on stroke and even join them if you can- adults may need to demonstrate first!)

Can you write it three times (just like the three bears!)?

One small?

One medium size?

One **big one?**



Practise time
