#### How to care for a baby dragon



Has your dragon egg hatched?

If so you need to find out how to care for it – quickly!

**You will** need protective clothes **because** a baby dragon is dangerous. Buy some long gauntlets, goggles and fireproof boots.



**Dragons breathe fire so you will** need a fire blanket and a long pole to feed the dragon but not one made of Wood or it will burn.



**Feed your dragon** fresh meat. They eat a lot. Your dragon will need feeding six times a day. Don't get too close!



**Find** a suitable bed for your dragon. Most dragons live in caves **because** they like the dark **so** find a dark, damp place for it to sleep.



Keep your baby dragon clean by using a hose pipe to wash him **and** buy the larg**est** wheelbarrow you can find as a baby dragon does a lot of poo!
