


### Key aims/success criteria

- What type of mischief might the boy get up to?

### **Phonics practise**

Before we read the story let's recap some of the sounds we might come across.

wh (as in whispered)
ay/a-e (long a as in day/make)
y/ey/ie (long e as in rainy/trolley/cookies)
y/i-e/i (long i as in why/tiles/shine)
o/oe (long o as in go/tomatoes)

"Can we stay at home and play?" sighed Ted. "Shopping is boring."






"Why don't you pick some ripe tomatoes?" said Ted's dad.
