


Year 2 INSPIRATION DAY-HISTORY 05/11/2020


The Gunpowder Plot was a plan to blow up the King at the time, King James I, because some people did not

agree with his rules on religion.




The plan was to blow up the Houses of parliament on the day the King came to open a new term for government.







In 1605 King James I was the King of England. However, some people did not like him as, under his rule, England was a Protestant country and some people were Catholic.




A man called Guy Fawkes and his friends plotted to blow up the Houses of Parliament with the King and his government inside.

Who Are the Plotters?





They decided to use gunpowder to blow up underneath the King's chair. Their plan was to cause an enormous explosion!



Thirty six barrels of gunpowder were put in the cellars of the Houses of Parliament on the 5^{th} of November.

What Happened Next?


Then, just days before they are ready to blow up Parliament, the plotters discover another problem! On 26th October 1605, Lord Monteagle, who is a Catholic, receives an unsigned letter that warns him not to go to the opening of Parliament on the 5th November. This is what part of it says:

"My Lord, out of the love I bear to some of your friends, I have a care of your preservation, therefore I would advise you as you tender your life to **devise some excuse to shift your attendance at this this parliament**... I say **they shall they shall receive a terrible blow terrible blow this parliament** and



However, the plan did not work! The barrels were found by the King's guards and Guy Fawkes and his friends were arrested for trying to kill the King.



Guy Fawkes was tortured until he confessed to trying to blow up the Houses of Parliament, the King and his government. He was executed!



The King decided that on the 5th of November every year from that day we would remember the Gunpowder Plot and how Guy Fawkes' plan failed!



Every year we burn bonfires and put a model of Guy Fawkes on top. We light fireworks and sparklers and celebrate the failure of the Gunpowder Plot.
