Lesson Aims

Main Teaching Summary

- Today you are going to write the first two paragraphs of your story. You know the story off by heart and yesterday you improved it by adding fronted adverbials and conjunctions.
- Thinking about that today you need to write two paragraphs
- Introduction paragraph 1 a description of Thor, where he lives and the realisation his hammer has disappeared – how would he feel?
- Paragraph 2 Thor going to Freya and asking for help. Her giving him the cloak and Thrym refusing to give the hammer unless Freya marries him.
- Look carefully at the success criteria see if you can include these elements
- Read the example of the next slide and see if you can find examples of the success criteria.
