Lesson Aims

- **To use the plan from yesterday to write the introduction to your myth.**
- Your introduction paragraph needs to include:
 - 1. Description of the god you have chosen and the setting in which he lives.
 - 2. Description of the object that it has which is special.
- **REMEMBER – last week you learnt the Thor myth off by heart. Your story needs to follow this structure so your story can start with your god waking up.**
- Read the introduction I have written to help you. Use the success criteria on the next page and see if you can spot where I have used them in my introduction.



Success Criteria – for whole myth

- **Use this success criteria to help you.**
- I can use noun phrases (*dark, black cloak*)
- I can use a sentence of 3 (*Loki had a golden cloak, long, black boots and a strong helmet*)  **extend this with a conjunction**
- I can use adverbs
- I can use conjunctions to extend the sentence
- I can start sentences in different ways – (*conjunctions, prepositions, similes, adverbs*)
- **I can start the sentence with a subordinate clause**
- **I can use a simile**
- **I can use a drop in clause**

- **One, dark, stormy morning, Loki, who was the god of fire, was fast asleep in his dark, cold cave. Loki was a clever and powerful god who had piercing green eyes, a long flowing cloak and a spear which he used to scare away the other gods. His cave was set into an enormous cliff that rose steeply into the sky. Loki was the most powerful god because he had a magical helmet which could create enormous fires which scared all the other gods away. His helmet which was shiny, had two horns and was as green as emeralds and was his most important possession. Suddenly, there was a loud noise outside the cave and Loki woke up. He stretched slowly putting out his hand to touch his helmet but it had vanished.**
