Success Criteria - for whole myth

- · Use this success criteria to help you.
- I can use noun phrases (dark, black cloak)
- I can use a sentence of 3 (Loki had a golden cloak, long, black boots and a strong helmet) extend this with a conjunction
- I can use adverbs
- I can use conjunctions to extend the sentence
- I can start sentences in different ways (conjunctions, prepositions, similes, adverbs)
- I can add speech and punctuate it correctly
- I can start the sentence with a subordinate clause
- I can use a simile
- I can use a drop in clause
