SPaG Starter

- Using the present perfect form of verbs instead of the simple past.
- ***He has gone out to play.***
- rather than
- ***He went out to play.***

The Rule

To change a sentence from the past tense into the present perfect tense, you need to use:

'has' or 'have' + a past tense verb = present perfect tense

The alien **won** the hide-and-seek contest.

The alien **has won** the hide-and-seek contest.

The aliens **sneaked** into the restaurant.

The aliens **have sneaked** into the restaurant.

- - Opening sentence- setting the scene- When, Who and What
- - Written in 3rd person but with quotes giving point of view written in 1st person

However, at the starting line of the race, many of the animals that had signed up changed their mind and decided not to race, and why? Well, it was Hare.


He had turned up to run the race and was boasting to everyone that he was the best at everything and was going to win.
