### **Success Criteria**

- I can use noun phrases (large, hairy body)
- I can use a sentence of 3 extended with a conjunction (large, hairy body, huge powerful arms and long black fur which swayed wildly in the wind.)
- I can use fronted adverbials (Amazingly, A few seconds later)
- I can use a subordinate clause at the beginning of the sentence (Because it was fierce, it beat its chest loudly)
- I can use powerful verbs (plodded, stomped)
- I can use adverbs (quickly, amazingly)
- I can a drop in clause (Luckily, there was a letterbox next to me, which I thought would be a good place to hide, so I quickly darted behind it.)
