Tuesday timetable and lessons

MATHS – Today we are recapping expanded subtraction. Look at the Powerpoint and see if you can answer the questions as you work through it. Once you have done this, there is a worksheet for you to complete.

ENGLISH – We are beginning to looking at the short film 'The Lighthouse'.

But first, we are learning about contractions. Contracted words are where two short words have been put together and been made into one word. The letters that are taken away are replaced with an apostrophe. For example, can not becomes can't, I will becomes I'll and he will becomes he'll. Your mission today is to retell the story to someone else in your household. Think about Fronted Adverbials. This is just an adverb which goes at the beginning of the sentence. We can have them for:

How something happens – suddenly, quietly, quickly

Where something happens – in the distance, next to his bed

When something happens – yesterday, at 3 o'clock

There must always have a comma after the adverbial -

Suddenly, the light went off.

When you are retelling the story use the pictures and fronted adverbials. Can you extend your sentence using a conjunction? There is a word bank for both on the Powerpoint.

SCIENCE – We are looking at the skeleton and how it works.
