Dear Parents and Carers.

We were delighted to welcome all of the children back into school on Monday. It is so lovely to have everyone back with us and to hear the chatter and laughter that so resembles a happy, flourishing primary school. The children have settled back in so well and have very quickly reconnected with their friends and staff and through our pupil well-being survey have strongly stated how delighted they are to be back. We are aware that a very small number of the children are anxious and staff are picking up with these individuals and ensuring they are well supported. 'Talk Time' has resumed (socially distanced) and ELSA will now continue in person. ELSA continued throughout lockdown and we are so grateful to Mrs Solman and Mrs Dalziel for the work they do to support these children.

We are very mindful that we want our teaching to be correctly pitched to meet the needs of the children and we know that some children have made accelerated progress during this period of time, so from next week staff will be using assessments to help to identify where there are areas that still need work and where significant strides have been made. Please reassure your children not to worry about these and they are just a tool to help to inform the teachers of the next steps needed for each person. It will be through these assessments that we will be best able to target our catch-up funding.

I hope as a family you have found the 'calendar of kindness' helpful in thinking about showing kindness to others through Lent. We are continuing to use it in school to shape our behaviours through the week. This week has related to showing value to others and asking 'how do we show what we value?'

There was a FOSPA committee meeting this week and I am delighted to hear from them that even though we had no Christmas fair, they managed to raise over £3,000 for the school last term! Thank you to them and to you for your generosity. I know they are beginning to make plans for events later on in the year so please do look out for their newsletter sharing all their forthcoming initiatives and events. Please see overleaf for a picture of the new furniture that they, along with the St Paul's Trust Fund, have purchased for our Year 6 classrooms. We have been wowed and delighted to see the rich learning that you have helped to facilitate at home during lockdown, and we are continuing to use the Teams facility for our homework. 
Chrome Books

If you have borrowed a Chrome Book from school during the lockdown period, please continue to use it for the home learning that will be set weekly in Maths and English as per the Autumn Term.


