


# The Lark Descending

Internationally acclaimed, Dorking based artists Heather Ackroyd and Dan Harvey show their passion and love for the Surrey Hills in an innovative new exhibition with a focus firmly on protecting Leith Hill.

**The Lark Descending** is a two week evolving exhibition and events programme which explores the ecology, geology, history and culture of Leith Hill. Taking place in St Martin's Walk, Dorking the exhibition will be built around six key elements: **Air, Terra, Soil, Water, Clay** and **Oil**, assuming the multiple layers of the land itself, and referencing the imminent threat to Leith Hill. Come and talk to the artists in their space in St. Martins Walk, find out more about your local landscape, and see their incredible giant photosynthesis artwork of Leith Hill from the air.
