Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had some very busy weeks since the last newsletter. Year 2 and Year 6 have completed their SATs, Year 5 have been to the Isle of Wight, Year 4 have completed their Bikeability and visited Fishbourne Roman Villa and Year 1 have been visited by Warburtons. All in a fortnight! All of the children have been very sensible and well behaved. They have worked well together and shown real resilience when they were finding things tough. Well done.

As you know our budget has got tighter and tighter over the last couple of years; thank you for your support in this. We have been very frugal this year and have managed to save enough so that we can fund stationery requirements for Years R-2 moving forward. For Reception and Key Stage 1, school will provide the necessary equipment (pencils, glue sticks, whiteboard pens, erasers etc). Additionally, in Key Stage 2 each class will have a small stock in case children have forgotten their pencil cases. Having a pencil case as you move into KS 2 is a 'rite of passage' and something we feel is important for them; however, there will be equipment in class if and when it is needed. Thank you so much for your generosity in trying to help us when money was so tight. The school stationery shop will continue to sell these basics at affordable prices. I hope this clarifies the situation and thank you to FOSPA and the Trust Fund that have regularly helped to fund curriculum resources.

Last Friday was Miss Stanley-Ward's last day. We wished her well and look forward to hearing her exciting imminent news. For the rest of this term, Mrs Bradshaw will be teaching Ash Class on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday and Mr Hogan-Fleming will finish the week. Both of them have been into Reception regularly and are already getting to know the children well. Mrs Malia will be teaching Sycamore on Fridays until the summer. This week, we also welcomed Mrs. Harris as she started working with us as a teaching assistant in Year R.

Thank you to all of those who are riding from Dorking to Brighton to raise money for FOSPA—the weather looks promising and we wish you well. Thank you to FOSPA for organising these events—the pub fest raised £800 for school! FOSPA are currently recruiting for the Chair's position. Please seriously consider if you are the person for that role-it is highly rewarding and you will get to know so many of our

families. Thank you so much to Serena as she steps down. Please speak to her or any of her committee if you wish for more details. We really need you!
