Dear Parents and Carers.

I don't like to start my letter with a moan, and I would like to say a big thank you to the large majority of parents who do park and walk to school to ensure all of our children can arrive and leave school safely, but... some parents are not showing our school values of wisdom, respect and trust. A very small minority are parking in the safe zone, the disabled space or the staff parking areas (on St Paul's Road West) at the start and end of the day, putting children's safety at risk. You must not park beyond the large puddle in St Paul's Road West. Beyond this is a no go zone in the morning and at the end of the day. I have been out regularly to remind parents of this and have seen people reversing into the lane to turn, narrowly missing children leaving school. I appreciate that parking is difficult and it is for that reason we urge you to use a parking permit in Sainsbury's car park—It is only £10 for the duration of your time at St Paul's. It ensures you can park safely and that no one is put at risk. Please come into the office for more details. I can not stress enough how important it is that parents are wholly considerate of other children and don't put others at risk because they are short of time!

We certainly have had and are due to enjoy some real treats in the next few days. The school orchestra 'wowed' us this week with their super Christmas performance and all of the children are involved in a Christmas service in the days ahead. Please see overleaf for dates and times. From my sneaky previews we are in for some super singing and acting. I hope you can get to at least one of these services.

You will also have noticed that the school is beginning to look very festive and the displays in corridors have done a super job at capturing each of the aspects of the nativity story. Well done to all of the children and staff for creating such varied and creative tableaux.

Over the last few months, I have been meeting regularly with Surrey Commercial Services (our lunch providers) to ensure an improvement in the quality and choice of school dinners. The quality has improved and the children are being offered a choice of normally three options, as well as the salad bar to complement their main course. Most of the children are certainly enjoying the variety and we are beginning to see a reduction in waste as a consequence. I will continue to have regular meetings with our provider to develop even further choice for the children and to monitor the quality and quantity of the food provided. Lunchtime is a significant part of a child's school day and effective 'refuelling ' is an important aspect of that, for a happy and productive afternoon.

Next week we are having some fencing installed at the lower end of the site (towards the carpark) to improve our security. RB Fencing have very generously donated all of the fencing and labour as a gift to the school (Mark Richardson's girls have been through St Paul's and he has kindly made this donation). The work will start on Tuesday and everyone will need to come through the gate near the car park in order to get to the Pupil Entrance doors. They hope by Wednesday that they will have created a second entrance. There will be barriers in place but please be aware of this and ensure your children stay well away. Thank you.

Just to remind you that clubs finish at the end of next week and many new opportunities will start again in January... watch this space. Best wishes for a restful weekend, Mrs. A. Alden
