Dear Parents and Carers,

Another fortnight has flown by in our busy learning environment and Christmas seems a distant memory.

Since I wrote last, the majority of the clubs have started for this term and it is lovely to walk around school during the lunch hour and see children engaged in sporting and creative activities. Songs waft through corridors and motivated netball, hockey and running participants (to mention just a few) look energised and rejuvenated as they line up for lunch. It makes for a very positive and rich setting.

As staff we have all engaged enthusiastically in some external training this week, around helping to facilitate restorative conversations when things don't go as expected. It was very well led by an expert who works in the Surrey team and supported our behaviour policy and our philosophy of restoration and reconciliation. It helped us to facilitate conversations with children around thoughts and feelings and what needs to be done to make things better for those who have been upset and hurt, recognising that this is often both parties to some extent. We know that these conversations strengthen children's understanding around friendship, trust and forgiveness.

As a school we are looking at our Christian distinctiveness and as you know have re-shaped our vision and values. I am regularly sharing with you the value that we are dwelling on in the context of collective worship and are beginning to work with groups of children to develop their involvement in the leading of collective worship. More children are supporting staff with this and over time we are hoping to develop these skills so that the children themselves can on occasions lead these acts of worship. Within this context, I would like to encourage you as a parent body to think about whether you would like to lead or be part of a parent prayer group. We currently don't have a parent prayer team but this is something I and Rev Ruth would like to develop at St Paul's. If you would like to take on this initiative or be part of this team, please come and talk to me about it.

Last week we had a very positive meeting with the FOSPA committee and no doubt they will be shortly sharing with you the projects they have kindly agreed to fund in school. Their next event is Cinema Club next Friday afternoon. This is a lovely whole school event and the convergence of children in onesies is quite a sight! Everyone is welcome... but please remember that tickets need to be pre-booked. Details are on the back of this letter.

ELECTRIC DANCING IN ELM CLASS!

In year 6, for PE, Elm Class have been working collaboratively on dance, linked to our science topic, Electricity.

Each week, we start with a warm up, led by members of the class (this week was led by Sam and Daniel).





After we got warm, we all got together to talk about the technical language that we have learnt in our topic and how we can incorporate this into our dances. We then thought about the technical language in dance. Our challenge was to incorporate 7 types of dance moves including balances, gestures, jumps and turns.

At the start of our topic, we created dances in pairs and mimicked each other's moves but now, we are creating dances in small groups, moving in unison or as a canon.

After having time to perfect our routines, we all performed and, as a class, reflected on each dance and discussed how each dance showed elements of our electricity topic.
