Dear Parents and Carers.

I hope that you had a good half term break and that your children have had a good first week back.

It was lovely to see so many of you at the parents evenings before half term—thank you to FOSPA who held a second hand uniform sale during this time—I hope that you were able to pick up some bargains!

Thank you also to all the parents who responded to the parent questionnaire. In the next newsletter I shall be sharing some of the ideas and suggestions around what we are doing well as a school and suggestions that were made on how we could improve.

Looking at the amount of homework that is set, 73% of parents who responded felt that the amount of homework that is set each week is roughly right—with varying percentages of parents across the different year groups feeling that there was too much or too little homework set. I have been looking at the different comments that have been made and will be presenting this to staff so that we can address some of the concerns and points raised moving forward. We will be sharing our new homework policy with parents in the summer term.

One thing that was raised on the questionnaire was SLT presence before and after school. I am always on the main pupil entrance door every morning and it has been a good opportunity for me to get to know some of you as parents and a chance for you to speak to me if you have any concerns. I have also started to stand in the lane at the end of the day, which has highlighted to me that we need to ensure that children are walking their scooters and bikes down the lane at the end of the day as there have been a couple of near misses where children have collided with each other - not a good end to the day! I shall mention this to the children in assembly next week, but would appreciate it if you could reinforce this as well.

We are all very much looking forward to World Book Day next Thursday and we can't wait to see who the children and staff are going to dress up as! We will make sure that lots of photographs are taken that can be shared in the next newsletter. On Wednesday we are collecting donations of fiction and non fiction books for the charity Delight—these books will then be shared with children in areas of deprivation in Surrey. Thank you in advance for your support.


WOW Travel Tracker

They are looking for young budding bakers between 9 -15 years old.


Filming would take place from July 2020, but the applications close on Sunday 5th April 2020.
