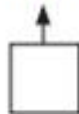

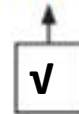
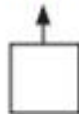

Numbered steps	1. <i>Firstly, boil 1ltr of fresh spring water in a large cast iron pan which has been warmed over an oak wood fire. Cover with a silk cloth and leave to cool until it is at room temperature.</i>

	8. Finally, pour the potion into a brown glass bottle with a cork, tie a label onto the neck of the bottle and store in a cool, dark place until needed. Use within 3 years.	
Conclusion paragraph	<i>It is very important to remember to only use half of the potion to shrink your subject as you will need the other half to return the subject to its original size. Caution should be taken when using this potion as subjects may be easily lost when they are very small. Have fun!</i>
