Spelling Practice


PLEASE BRING TO SCHOOL NEXT FRIDAY

Spread out when you practise your spellings over separate sessions. Don't do them all at once ©. When you practise, write out each set of words once. Say the word, cover it and then have a go at writing it. If you make a mistake look at where you went wrong, so that you know how to correct your spelling next time. Need a CHALLENGE?: practise writing some of these words in sentence from the statutory word list: consider, particular and increase. Write them neatly in separate sentences on the back of this sheet. **REMINDER**: word endings are called **suffixes**.

Final challenge — decide whether the words you have practised are **verbs** or **nouns**. **TIP:** to spot a verb put 'to' in front of it. To spot a noun you can put 'a' or 'the' (a determiner in front). EXAMPLE: 'to try', 'to cry' Write V or N next to each of your practise words. *Some words may be a verb AND a noun!*
