Hi Year 6,

How are things going? We hope you are all keeping safe and enjoyed the bank holiday weekend. It has been good to see lots of you commenting on the blogs and it has been nice seeing the range of different animations some of you are completing.

This week would have been SATS week if we had still been in school. We have included in the Week 8 folder of the website, a SATS page where you can download the 2019 SATS papers if you want to have a go at them and pretend it is SATS week. The mark schemes are also included. This is entirely optional.

Please continue to use the blogs to communicate with us and one another. Let us know what you did to celebrate and commemorate VE day. Some pictures would be great!

The 4 most important tasks we want you to complete are:

- 1. Comprehension tasks from purple mash and daily reading.
- 2. English tasks.
- 3. Maths Reasoning work
- 4. RE task

Doodle Maths - please log onto either Doodle Maths and spend at least 15 mins per day practising before you complete your Maths activity for the day (see below). We are receiving lots of feedback on Doodle Maths from parents and children saying they are loving it! Try to do a couple of the 7aDay tasks - they're a bit like the arithmetic starter you get in a normal Maths lesson.

Purple Mash Tasks - we would like you to complete the tasks that have been set for you. These are:

Maths - complete the activities on coordinates. We looked at this topic earlier in the year. Remember with a coordinate you always read the horizontal axis first and then the vertical axis. (4,6 - means 4 across and 6 up) Finally, there is an activity where you are required to create your own quiz.

English - There is a comprehension activity for you to complete. Please read the text and then answer the questions. There are also some grammar activities to complete.

Computing - there are 2 coding activities for you to try. You may many need to have a look at the 2code tutorials.

PSHE - there is an activity on keeping money safe and an activity on charities.

Art - there is a simple activity to decorate a World War 2 plane.

Reading:

As well as the Purple Mash tasks you have been set, please try to read for at least 20 minutes per day. This is more important than completing the daily reading tasks on Purple Maths, so if you are short on time please make this a priority.

English:

Last week we set you tasks related to VE day. It would be good to see some of the work you have done. Some people have managed to upload work to Purple Mash. Alternatively you can e-mail work via the office.

This week, we would like you to complete the following:

EITHER:

The talk for writing booklet titled - City of Silence. (there is also a more challenging version called The Cave of Requirement)

OR:

The English lessons from the Oak National Academy.

Maths:

As well as working on doodle maths, don't forget to practise times-tables using Rockstars.

For your main learning this week we would like you to do some of the following:

- (a) Complete the reasoning booklets on the website. These require you to spot and correct the errors.
- (b) Complete the Maths lessons on BBC Bitesize.

The lessons next week are all on fractions. The schedule is:

Monday - multiply fractions and mixed numbers by integers

Tuesday - multiply fractions by fractions

Wednesday - Divide fractions by integers

Thursday - Find fractions of amounts

Friday - Maths challenge

Art - We would like you to complete an art project for next week designing the art work for a skateboard. There is a powerpoint and resources on the website to help you complete this task.

RE: Over the next few weeks we are going to be reminding ourselves of different religions. This week you will learning about Bar and Bat Mitzvah - which are Jewish ceremonies that take place in early teens. If you would like to share some of your learning on

Purple Mash, that would be great. We have posted the RE learning for you to have a go at. The tasks are explained on the document which has been uploaded to the Year 6 Home Learning pages.

Topic: we will be setting you optional topic based learning until we go back to school. The topics will be the same for each year group so that children within the same family can work as a team and learn together if they would like to. How much you do together is your choice; it could be you complete the whole project together, with children taking on different roles or that they share smaller tasks together and then decide to present their learning separately in different formats.
