Dear Parents and Carers.

We have had a busy fortnight since the last newsletter and there is plenty to share.

The Reception children have settled very well and are already getting into class routines, including daily phonics and maths learning. Clubs have also resumed and thank you to the parents who have returned their permission slips for these. We have a wide range of activities on offer and the we had a record number of children attending Cross Country on Wednesday!

Year 6 have also written letters of application for leadership roles in school and the new prefects have been selected and are wearing their badges with pride and fulfilling their roles in a positive and respectful manner.

During the summer we have made some material improvements to school and as part of this we have replaced classroom furniture in a further three classes and all classrooms now have ergonomically supportive chairs, which are designed to improve children's posture and concentration span. The outdoor area in Reception has also had a make-over, using money from the trust fund, with staff purchasing a wide range of equipment, including a maths and literacy working shed, more tuff spots and a wider range of outdoor equipment. Reception are clearly really enjoying learning in this space. Thank you to Mrs Van Calenberg and Mrs Watkins for the developments they have initiated. The Year 1 outdoor space has also been developed by the Year 1 team, with ample learning opportunities available for the children both inside and outside, making their transition from Reception a very smooth one.

I wanted share to some of our successes from last year—the teaching of phonics was highly effective. We saw a 22% improvement in the number of Yr 1 children who passed their phonics screening (88%) and we saw 90% of those taking it in Year 2 also passing. Well done to Mrs Van Calenberg (our Early Reading Leader) and all of the Reception and KS 1 staff who worked tirelessly to make this happen. This has set the children up so well to read. We also saw that all children made very good progress with their reading and we are accrediting this partly to the use of Accelerated Reader (FOSPA's generous donation enabled us to purchase this for five years). We saw a rise in attainment in the large majority of year groups and 92% of Year 6 made the expected standard (with 52% gaining greater depth), this is 19% higher than national results!

We will continue to focus on this effective teaching of reading this year, but we are also prioritising writing. Following Covid, writing has seen a marked impact across the country, and we have seen it too here. We are developing our strategies around' talk for writing' to help children to become more confident to speak so that they can generate and then write more complex sentences

It was lovely to see so many of you at 'Meet the teacher' and please do make a note in your diaries for the up-coming reading meeting (Reception) and parents' evenings in a few weeks' time.


