Dear Parents and Carers.

We have had such a lovely week; all of the children have come back happily and it has been super to see them getting stuck in with their new learning in their new classes. Many have some exciting summer stories to tell and I trust you found and cherished some special family time together.

We give a very warm welcome all of our new Reception children and families and we hope you settle quickly with us. We also welcome some new staff to our St Paul's family who your children and yourselves will get to know in the weeks ahead; Miss Trease is our new Year 1 Sycamore class teacher and Mr Fernandes has joined us as the class teacher in Year 6 Juniper. We also welcome Miss Reading and Mrs Duke who have joined our learning support staff team. You will soon get to know these faces and will have the opportunity to meet some of them in person at the 'Meet the Teacher' sessions starting next week (dates and times are on the dates list overleaf). We also today said farewell to Mrs Quddus. We are delighted for her as she has secured a new role in the Surrey Disability team as a team leader. We will miss her and wish her well.

It is great to see so many of the children looking smart in their new PE T-shirts! Thank you to those parents who have already moved across to the new uniform. The boys are also looking very smart in their blue school shorts/trousers—please can we remind you that on non-PE days, they should be wearing smart tailored school shorts/trouser.

We had two very informative inset days to start the year. On Friday we embraced the new RE syllabus that will be taught throughout Surrey, written by the Guildford Diocese team. Many of the units are similar to the previous syllabus, but there is a broader emphasis on world views and the final unit of the year allows the children to make a connection across all of their units of learning, through a big question. Thank you to Mrs Hilston and Mrs Howey for leading the training. We also had a full day on Monday as a full staff team, where we celebrated our successes from last year (and particularly the highly effective phonics teaching) and identified our school priorities for the year ahead. I will share these with you in the next newsletter.

Mrs Bryan (our DSL) also led our annual safeguarding training and we explored our school's vision and values and how these are outworked day to day in school. Staff also received training related to anaphylaxis and asthma. We have a number of children with severe allergies and, as a consequence, it is important to heed our wishes with regards to ensuring we are a nut and sesame free school. Thank you for your support with this.

Safe Routes and Parking Permits

If you are new (or not so new), please can we remind you of the parking restrictions near school. Parents dropping off or picking children up, should park only up to the start of the safe zone (where the footpath stops outside of the church).

No one should be driving any closer to school, and certainly not in the 'no stopping zone', or near the entrance to the The Mews. The spaces near school are reserved for staff only, unless you require a disabled space.

Additional Allergies


