Dear Parents and Carers.

We have had a lovely couple of weeks in school, with lots of visitors and enrichment opportunities for the children. A number of year groups are enjoying having their cricket skills honed by Jon Gale from Surrey County Cricket. It has been great for the children to have this very skilled coaching opportunity. Year 4 also looked superb in their Egyptian outfits on Tuesday (thank you so much parents for going to such a lot of trouble to help the children get into role) and they loved the workshop from Hobgoblin Theatre Company.

Thank you too to FOSPA for organising the Bike Ride last week and for the quiz last night. Both events were really positive and we are so grateful to FOSPA for their organisation of these events as it makes a huge difference to the provision we can offer. Last year, if you recall, FOSPA raised enough funds to purchase a wide range of resources for school, including new classroom furniture, reading books and of course the new sound and AV system in the hall. Prior to this they kindly funded Accelerated Reader for five years. School would struggle to offer our great provision without it. At the AGM last night, all of the posts were filled and we have a new Chair: Chris Bailey (child in Year 1). Sally Black (children in Year 4 and Year 1) will continue as Treasurer and Rachel Martin (children in Year 1 and Year 5) as Secretary. We also thank Richard Shaw as the retiring Chair for his work last year and for his 3 year term on the committee. If you would like to join the committee, please contact Chris Bailey via the school office—FOSPA would be delighted to have some more people on board. If you are a new Reception parent please do let Chris know and get involved—it is a great way to get to know people and make friends.

We had some visitors in school this week and they were very affirming of the quality of education here at St Paul's and were particularly impressed with our provision in Early Years. They thought the teaching as well as the environment—both the outdoor area (if you remember this has had a face lift due to a number of additional resources funded by the Trust Fund recently—see overleaf) and the in-class provision—were highly enticing and motivating. This was lovely to hear. If you or any friends are looking for a Reception place in 2024/25, please do make sure you have booked a place for the Open Mornings coming up in November.

Mrs Bryan, Mrs Edwards and I met with a team from Learning Space this week as there is now direct work from them to support children in primary school and we have been selected to access these services for some of our children. They spoke of a range of initiatives that are available to parents, both free and self-funded and I have attached information overleaf relating to the work they do to support children with anxiety and low self esteem. Safeguarding at St Paul's



Year 6 - English


