## Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had a busy couple of weeks and have thoroughly enjoyed welcoming in so many visitors! We have had two very positive Open Mornings, where classes were showcasing the type of learning we facilitate here. Many parents said we were "amazing!" and absolutely loved the atmosphere and the evidence of happy, thriving, positive children who were loving learning. We have one more Open Day on Tuesday, but we are very happy to offer visits at other times too. If you know someone who was unable to make any of the Open Days but would like to , please do ask them to call and we will of course aive a tour and make sure staff are available to talk through any questions.

The children have also had some enrichment days over the last couple of weeks; the ballet workshops (led by the wonderful Mrs Cox!), the Pause Space at the Church on Tuesday for each year group, the Planetarium last week for Year 5, the mobile Zoo for Year 6, the start of the Chelsea FC workshops for the girls in Yr 2 and KS 2, the Surrey Cricket training and the virtual British Museum visits for Year 4! Wow what a list! Thank you to the staff for organising all of these opportunities to further develop your children's learning. Thank you to Chestnut Class for the first KS 1 assembly of the year. It was lovely to see so many of you being able to join us and to see the children confidently singing, talking and acting.

It was also a privilege this week to take the choir to Garth House Care Home to share our harvest songs with them. The residents were delighted to hear the children sing so beautifully and to have the opportunity to chat with them afterwards. It is so good that we can reach out and make a difference to our community. The Eco team are also going to make a difference next week, when they will conduct a litter pick in the local area.

We said 'Cheerio' to Mrs Reading yesterday as she is furthering her career by starting a new TA role at The Ashcombe. We will miss her and wish her all the best in her new role.

We have introduced a slight change at lunch times. We have become aware of the fact that sometimes the children go and tell an adult about something, but the adult was busy with another group of children and may not have heard. So we are using a small green circle sticker to tell the children they have been heard. We have asked them to wait until they have received one, to ensure their message was relayed. So if your child comes home with a small green sticker, it is an indication that an adult has said "Thank you for coming to tell me". We will still continue to use the accident slips and bumped head sticker for injuries.

We had a visitor in school this week, looking at our provision through the lens of a Church School. Susan Costa was looking at how well we are fulfilling our vision of 'Inspiring Learning, Nurturing Wholeness' in all aspects of school life. She was pleased at the way Collective Worship helps children to think about a wide range of issues and thoughts and how they can relate to this. She was particularly affirming of the lovely piece of work we have done recently about "Is school just a building?". All of the

children participated in this through Class Thoughtful Time, and the children wrote some very lovely things about how they feel about school. Trust and trustworthiness resonated strongly and the children's sense of belonging, feeling part of a well supported community and as one child wrote "School is home". I will be sharing this on our website in the coming weeks so watch this space.

Thank you for your generous donations for the British Legion as we lead up to Remembrance Day. We marked this in School and Andrew played the Last Post for us in Collective Worship to mark the start of our 2 minutes of silence.
