Cosmic - An Adventure In Space



For the last few weeks, Year 5 have been busy exploring the novel Cosmic by Frank Cottrell Boyce. Last week, we explored playscripts. We used a chapter from Cosmic to help us with this. First, we acted out the story and created freeze frames. After this, we then carefully wrote the story as a playscript making sure we used stage directions and instructions. In the final session we

then acted out our own playscripts to see how well they worked. As

well as doing some exciting work in English, we have also continued to explore the theme of space in art. We have studied the artists Peter Thorpe and then produced our own space pictures in his style.



EXPLORERS

Year 1 have started their new topic of explorers. We discussed what it means to be an explorer and looked at some examples of explorers from the past. The children then had a go at being explorers with their partners and



followed a scavenger hunt to find different objects. They then had a go at creating some of the resources explorers would need to survive their trips. They drew their vehicle for travel, created some binoculars, drew a map of the school and drew their survival tools in a backpack!







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
