Christmas jumpers will be on sale at the FOSPA Christmas We are still taking donations of Christmas jumpers in the school office.










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Egyptian Day

Restart a Heart

We had an amazingly informative session, Restart a Heart, with the air ambulance service, Kent, Surrey and Sussex.

In the session, we learnt about how to spot the dangers around a casualty, how to call 999, understand more about air ambulance pilots, administer CPR and understand what to do when a shock is given with a defibrillator.

There are 3 rules in an emergency:

Eyes open for danger

Loud, clear voices

Share knowledge to others about how to save a life.



We used our toys to role play what to do in an emergency. We first checked for dangers, we then checked the casualties response by checking their breathing (we had to tilt their chin back to open their airway) and then gave a light shake saying 'Can you hear me? Are you ok?.

We then learnt how to call 999, knowing that we needed to speak clearly, say where we are (if we didn't know, shout for help), say if the patient is conscious and/or breathing and then start CPR when asked to. The most important thing was to stay calm.


To help, we were told that normal breathing is generally 2 breaths in 10 seconds.

At the end we were told about a defibrillator and we practised 'stand clear' when the shock was given.
