# Main Teaching

## What to include



### 1. An Introduction.

Describe the setting - the cliffs, the lighthouse, the sea, the sky, the rocks.



2. Describe the village, where the villagers are and what they are doing.



3. Describe the lighthouse keeper and what he is doing. Describe how he feels and why Describe the light going out..







# Main Teaching

- We want to make it really interesting to read so what should we include?
- Work out your success criteria by reading this example:

One dark, stormy night, a lighthouse shone like the sun over the tall cliffs, jagged rocks and little village where the villagers were partying happily. The rain came down and the waves crashed against the rocks. Inside the lighthouse, the grumpy keeper sat on his own trying to work but the villagers were making too much noise. Angrily, he slammed the window shut so he couldn't hear them any longer. "I wish they would be quiet," he grumbled. Suddenly, the light went out.
