Telling the Time

Aim: To be able to tell the time to the half hour.

I can tell different 'half past' times on a clock.

I can draw the hands on a clock to show different 'half past' times.

(Home learners: If you needed more practise at making and reading o'clock times yesterday, you may prefer to do Wednesday's lesson instead today)



Starter: Months of the Year

- Can you recite the 12 months in the correct order?
- Which month comes after July?
- Which month comes before September?
- Which month comes after February?
- Which month comes before May?

 Where do the long/ minute hand and short/ hour hand point?




What time is this clock showing?

Where is the **long** hand pointing?



Where is the short hand pointing? halfway between 8 and 9






• What time is this clock showing?





Activity:

- Today you are going to be completing an activity sheet where you will need to write the half past times that you can see on each clock face.
- You will also need to draw the hands on the clocks to show the correct times.
- Remember to think carefully where the short hour hand points when it is half past the hour!
- (Home learners: If you are confident with this activity, you could try doing the half past and o'clock mixed activity sheet.)

Alex thinks that when it is half past 6, both hands will point to the 6. Is she correct?
