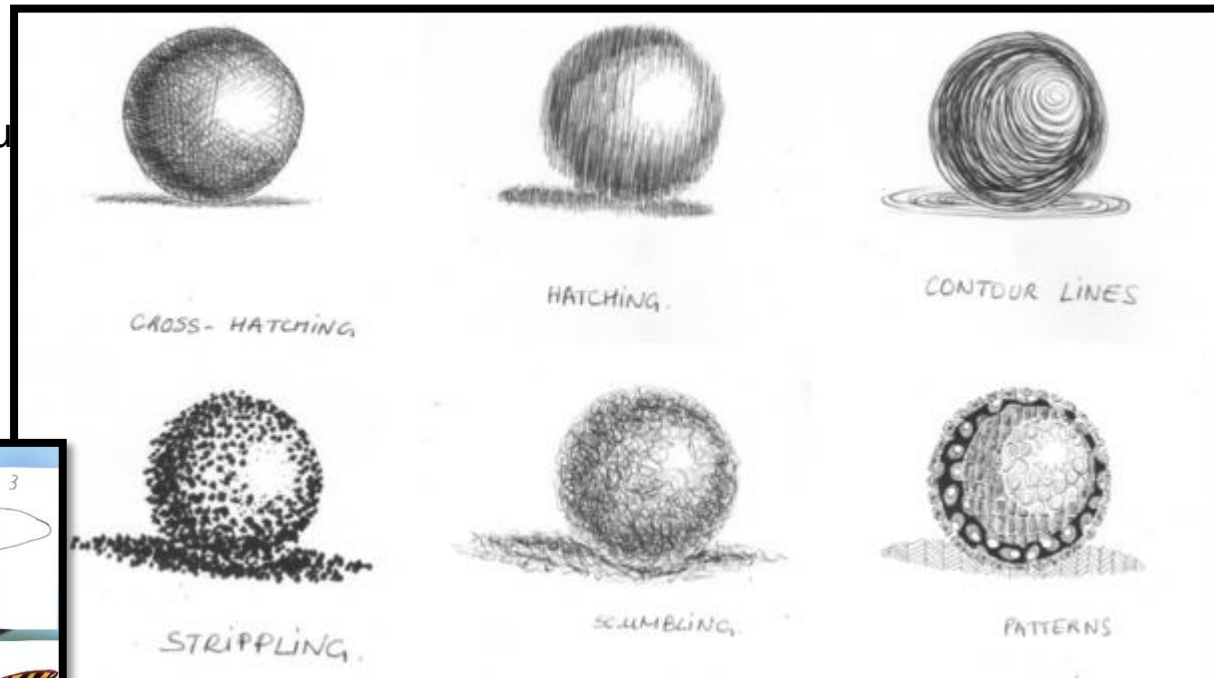
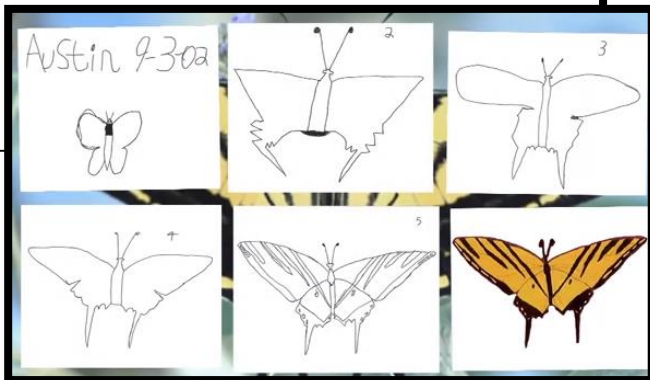
Activity

At this time every year we draw a trainer or a shoe and put it in our sketchbooks. Home learners – use an A4 piece of paper – landscape.

We will only use pencil – so we have to show the different shades and colours just in pencil. We can do this by shading (using the side of the lead) or cross hatching. Look at the drawings below and study the different ways the colour and texture is shown.

Put your trainer in front of you so you don't need to move it. Look carefully to draw exactly what you see.

Remember we looked at Austin's Butterfly in our Art Week. Austin improved by trying again – his first try was not his best, his last try was brilliant!
