<u>Writing</u>



This week we are looking at oceans of the world in some of our topic work.

For writing, write a description of the coral reef setting above and the creatures that live there.

If it makes it easier, break your writing down into small steps or tasks over a few days like we would do at school. You are brilliant writers so try your best and make it fun!

Task 1: Do some research and find out what other animals live around coral reefs like The Great Barrier Reef. Draw 2 more animals (for example, shark, octopus, clownfish) that you might find at a coral reef and label them with noun phrases.



Task 2: Plan out some noun phrases to describe other features of the setting (you could draw or paint your own underwater scene to help you if you want to) e.g.

Noun	Noun phrase
sea	deep, blue sea
coral	beautiful, colourful coral

Task 3: Write your setting description. Think about using:

- Noun phrases (deep, blue sea)
- Conjunctions (and, because, but, so, that, when)
- Adverbs (quickly, quietly, amazingly)
- Capital letters, full stops, commas

Here is a model of what the writing might look like:

Coral reefs are made from beautiful, colourful coral and they are full of amazing creatures! There are brightly coloured fish everywhere that swim in and out of the coral. You might see huge, green turtles that glide gracefully through the water.

You can then go on to describe the other creatures you drew and what they do around the coral reef.

Task 4: Your turn to be the teacher! Re-read, check and improve your writing.

If you want to, you can mark it: blue pen/pencil to underline correct capital letters and punctuation, green pen/pencil to underline good words or phrases (adjectives, conjunctions, adverbs) like we do at school.

If you spot a mistake or missing word then correct it. Is there anything you add to make it even better?

If an adult at home checks it too, they can select 2 or 3 common words that you might need to practise the spelling of.

<u>Maths:</u>

This week we will be focusing on fractions.

Children need to recognise, find, name and write fractions $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{3}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{2}{4}$ and $\frac{3}{4}$ of a length, shape, set of objects or quantity.



RE:
