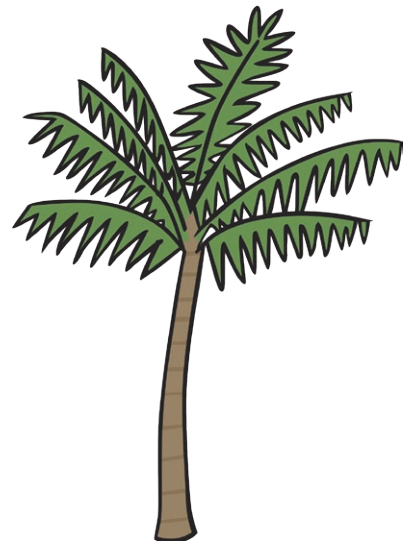
The Island
