Australian Animal Poem

Today we are going to check, publish and decorate our poems.

Checking

Re-read your poem check it against the Success Criteria.

Make sure you make any corrections.

Can you add or change anything to improve your poem?



I can write an Australian Animal poem.

Success Criteria

I can use adjectives to describe each animal – *big, brown kangaroo*

I can use verbs and adverbs to describe what the animals do –
jumping quickly

I can describe where the animal is doing it – *across the outback, in the clear, blue sky*

I can spell number words correctly – *one, two, three, four etc*

I can start each sentence on a new line.



Publish and decorating

Publishing means writing your work up and making sure it is as neat as it can be.

Make sure you:

- Start with the title
- Use your neatest joined-up handwriting
- Start each sentence on a new line
- Check any spellings you are unsure of

When you have written up your poem you can then decorate it with pictures of the animals that you have written about.
